

Before Installing Firebird

Before starting any Firebird installations, it is advisable to uninstall any previous Firebird versions. To uninstall any Firebird servers, go to Programs and features in Windows Control Panel, Select Firebird Featured Project file, right click and click on 'Uninstall'. To uninstall Firebird on a Linux system, first go to the start menu, open the Terminal and run the command '\$ sudo apt-get remove firebird-server'

Before taking down and uninstalling the Firebird database on your system, make sure that you back up all your databases for you to restore them later under Firebird 3.

You can also back up your old security database 'security2.fdb'. Inside the firebird SQL script security_database.sql which is located in (misc/upgrade/security), you can update the old security database to Firebird 3, preserving all the information except SYSDBA's and except any passwords.

Make sure that you have a running Windows or Linux operating system which runs, a good network connection, and administrator privileges on your system.

Installing Firebird For Windows Version 3.0

If this is the **first time you are installing Firebird**, it is strongly recommended that you use the Executable release kit for Windows. After installing the Executable Kit you can start the [Firebird Version 3.0.10 Windows Executable Installation \(Recommended for first-time users\)](#).

Installing Firebird For Windows Version 4.0

Firebird 4.0 introduces new data types and many improvements without radical changes in architecture or operation, the most important are: logical replication, longer metadata identifiers,

international time zone support, and timeouts for connections and statements. You can access the [Firebird 4.0.2 Release Notes](#) to see a detailed report on the changes and improvements which are implemented.
